

Chapter 15

Motor Vehicles and Traffic

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Part 1**General Regulations****§15-101. Definitions and Interpretation.**

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for Sections or Parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa C.S.A. §101 *et seq.*, as amended, except that, in this Chapter, the word "road" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway," and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.

2. The term "legal holidays" as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

3. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

§15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Township of Cumberland, Adams County, Pennsylvania, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action.

§15-103. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

1. The Chief of Police shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency.

A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.

B. In the case of emergency public works or public events of limited scope or duration, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.

2. These temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the police department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who drives or parks a vehicle in violation of any such regulation shall be guilty of a violation and, upon convictions, shall be liable to the penalty set out in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of that nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set out the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of \$50 and costs.

§15-104. Experimental Regulations.

The Chief of Police or the Board of Supervisors may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the roads in the Township where, for a period of not more than

90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate those locations by proper signs and markings. Those regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall drive or park a vehicle in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall remove, move, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty set out in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of \$50 and costs. Provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability or permanent changes in the ordinances of the Township of Cumberland relative to traffic and parking.

§15-105. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events.

1. The Chief of Police or the Board of Supervisors shall have authority to close any road or specific part of a road to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.

2. The Chief of Police or the Board of Supervisors shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any road where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagmen is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

3. *Penalty.* Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 and costs.

§15-106. Use of Streets by Processions and Assemblages.

1. For the purpose of this Section, the words "assemblage" and "procession" shall have the following meanings:

Assemblage - a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any road.

Procession - a group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a road in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from the Chief of Police, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least 3 weeks in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to

participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from the Chief of Police, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made a least 3 weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is under way, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time by which the end of the procession shall have reached the end of the route of the procession and the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to the time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit.

4. Proof of insurance for the event shall be provided to the Chief of Police prior to the proposed date of the event, this policy to be no less than \$1,000,000 general liability.

5. *Penalty.* Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$300 and costs.

§15-107. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the Township shall have authority to direct traffic on the streets in the Township, at intersections in public and in other places where the Vehicle Code or this Chapter applies, and shall be responsible for the enforcement of this Chapter.

§15-108. Protection of Road Surfaces.

1. Any contractor, excavator, builder, landscaper or other person engaged in construction, home improvement, etc. shall, before leaving a job site, clean road surfaces and remove all obstruction, rocks, clumped dirt and other materials placed on the highway by equipment used on the job site.

2. No vehicle equipped with metal wheels or metal tracks shall be driven on any Township road without the expressed written consent of the Township Supervisors, such written consent shall be given upon the issuance of a building permit by the Zoning Officer.

3. Where it is necessary to cross under a Township road, any company, corporation, contractor, excavator, builder, landscaper or other person engaged in the installation of drainage pipe, utility lines, when installing same, may not employ a device that does not drill or bore a tunnel under the road. Devices used to drive holes shall not be used.

4. *Definition.* "Driving holes" for the purpose of the Section shall mean a device used to force a hole between trenches placed on either side of the road.

5. *Penalties.* Any person, company or corporation found guilty of this Section

shall upon conviction pay a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$600 plus the costs of prosecution thereof. Further provided, the convicted party shall be responsible for the repair or replacement of the damaged portion of the road.

Part 2**Traffic Regulations****§15-201. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Roads.**

1. Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified road, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle, on any part of a road where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the road:

§15-202. Stop Intersections Established.

1. The following intersections are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named road (the intersecting through road) on the first-named road (the stop road) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first-named road or stop road, in the direction indicated in each case, shall stop the vehicle as required by §3323 (b) of the Vehicle Code, and shall not proceed into or across the second-named road or intersecting road until he has followed all applicable requirements of that section of the law.

§15-203. Disorderly Operation of a Vehicle.

1. It shall be unlawful at all times within the Township, for any person operating, or being in physical control of a motor vehicle, to race the engine of the vehicle, spin the tires, or to give a display of acceleration, for no legitimate purpose.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle in a physically offensive manner, or endanger, or cause annoyance or alarm to the traveling public upon any highway, or traffic way, or road within the boundaries of the Township of Cumberland.

3. Any person who violates subsection .1 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to

pay a fine of \$75 and costs of prosecution.

4. Any person who violates subsection .2 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to

pay a fine of not less than \$25 and not more than \$100 plus the costs of prosecution. (Ord. 6/9/1992, 6/9/1992, Art. II, §3)

§15-204. Open Alcoholic Containers in Vehicles.

1. Each person within a motor vehicle is responsible for complying with the provisions of this Section pertaining to carrying open containers. The operator of a motor vehicle is the person responsible for complying with the provisions of this Section that pertains to the storage of an open container.

2. Carrying or storing a bottle, can or other receptacle containing an alcoholic beverage that is open, or has been opened, or whose seal is broken or the contents of which have been partially removed, within a motor vehicle in Cumberland Township is prohibited.

3. *Exceptions.* This Section does not apply to the following:

A. An open container stored in the trunk of a motor vehicle or, if a motor vehicle is not equipped with a trunk, to an open container stored in some other portion of the vehicle designed for the storage of luggage and not normally occupied by or readily accessible to the operator or passengers.

B. An open container stored in the living quarters of a motor home or camper.

4. For the purpose of §15-213.1 and .2, a utility compartment or glove compartment is deemed to be readily accessible to the operator and passengers of a motor vehicle.

5. *Penalties.* The violation of any provision of this Section is punishable by a fine not less than \$50 and not more than \$600 or imprisonment of not less than 5 days.

§15-205. Rollerskates, Skateboards, Coaster and Toy Vehicles Prohibited.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in rollerskating, skateboarding or to ride upon or propel any coaster or other toy vehicle upon any roadway except in order to cross the roadway.

2. *Penalty.* Any person violating this Section shall upon conviction pay a fine of not less than \$10 and not more than \$100 plus the costs of prosecution.

§15-206. Vehicle Weight Limits Established on Certain Streets and Bridges.

1. On the following bridges and streets or parts of streets, by authority granted under §4902 (a) of the vehicle code, it shall be unlawful for any person or person(s) to drive any vehicle or combination having a gross weight in excess of the maximum prescribed below for that bridge or street or part of street, as the case may be.

Street or Bridge	Location	Maximum Gross Weight
CMT-2	Blackhorse Tavern Rd. over Willoughby Run	Single Vehicle 25 Tons Combination 34 Tons
Railroad Bridge	Belmont Rd.	Single Vehicle 3 Tons Combination 3 Tons

Provided, nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person from driving an emergency vehicle, school bus, or commercial vehicle making local pick-up and deliveries from any houses along these roads.

2. The Board of Supervisors may issue permits for the movement of motor vehicles or combinations of size and weight in excess of restrictions imposed by subsection .1, or require security as necessary to cover the cost of anticipated or probable repairs and/or restoration necessitated by the permitted movement of vehicles. All actions taken under the authority of this section shall be taken in accordance with rules and regulations adopted from time to time by the Board of Supervisors and in the absence thereof in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

3. The Township shall erect or cause to be erected and maintained restriction signs designating the restrictions at each end of a bridge or portion of road restricted as provided in this Section. In the case of a restriction on a bridge or on a road which does not begin or end at an intersection with an unrestricted road, the Township shall also place an advance informational sign at the intersection nearest each end of the restricted bridge or portion of road which would allow drivers to avoid the restricted bridge or portion of road. No person shall be convicted of violating any subsection of this section unless the restriction sign designating the restricted bridge or portion of road to traffic moving in the direction the person was driving was posted as required in this subsection.

4. Any person operating a motor vehicle or combination upon a road or bridge in violation of a prohibition or restriction imposed by this section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine and costs as specified by §4902 g-1 of the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania.

Part 3

Stopping, Standing and Parking

§15-301. Parking Prohibited at All Times in Certain Locations.

1. Parking shall be prohibited at all times in the following locations:

2. Parking prohibited at certain times in certain locations:

§15-302. Handicapped or Disabled Veteran Parking Spaces.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle in a handicapped parking space or spaces provided for handicapped, disabled veterans unless their vehicle is equipped with handicapped/disabled veteran registration plates or the operator has placed a handicapped/disabled veteran placard prominently on the dashboard of the vehicle.

§15-303. Parking and Loitering Prohibited.

Between the hours of sunset and sunrise, no vehicle shall be parked nor shall any person be allowed to loiter in the area between Roberta Way and Sach's Mill covered bridge on Waterworks Road. Nothing in this Part shall prohibit permitted activities from taking place.

§15-304. Penalty.

Any person who violates any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15. Provided it shall be the duty of the police officers to report all violations of any provision of this Part indicating, in each case, the Section violated; the license number of the vehicle involved in the violation; the location where the violation took place; and any other facts that might be necessary in order to

secure a clear understanding of the circumstances attending the violation. The police officer making the report shall also attach to or place upon every such vehicle a notice stating that the vehicle was in violation of this Part. The notice shall contain instructions to the owner or driver of the vehicle that if he will report to the Cumberland Township Municipal Building during normal business hours and pay the sum of \$10 within 5 days after the time of the notice, or if he will place the sum of \$10, enclosed within the envelope provided, in the United States mail, postage pre-paid, within said 5 days. After 5 days, the owner or driver shall pay \$15 in the manner prescribed above. This act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine and costs prescribed in the first sentence of this Section.

Part 4**Removal and Impounding of Certain Vehicles****§15-401. Applicability and Scope.**

1. This Section is enacted under authority of §6109 (a) (22) of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A.. §6109(a)(22). It gives authority to the Township Police to remove and impound:

- A. Vehicles that are parked on any road in violation of Part.
- B. Vehicles that are parked or abandoned in violation of the Vehicle Code.

§15-402. Authority to Remove and Impound.

The Township Police shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, or any vehicle parked illegally, provided that the circumstances of the parking were with the conditions stated in §15-401. *Provided*, no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part.

§15-403. Notification of Removal and Impounding.

1. Within 24 hours from the time of removal of any vehicle under authority granted by this Part, notice of the fact that the vehicle was removed shall be sent by the Police Department to the owner of record of the vehicle. This notice shall designate the place from which the vehicle was removed, the reason for removal and impounding, and the location of the vehicle.

2. When the owner or person in control of the vehicle is present the officer initiating the removal/impounding of the vehicle shall inform that person of the requirements of subsection .1 and this notice shall fulfill the requirements set forth.

§15-404. Effect of Payment of Towing and Storage Charges.

The payment of any towing and storage charges authorized by this Part, unless payment is made "under protest," shall be final and conclusive, and shall constitute a waiver of any right to recover the money so paid. If payment of any towing or storage charges is made "under protest," the offender shall be entitled to a hearing before a district justice. Payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Part for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§15-405. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.

The Chief of Police shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under

this Section and shall be able at reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the status of the vehicle.

§15-406. Restrictions Upon Removal of Vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under authority of this Part, if at the time of intended removal, the owner or person in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately and is physically able to do so.

§15-407. Schedule of Towing and Storage Charges.

1. The owner of the vehicle impounded shall be liable for the towing charge as prescribed by the towing agent plus an additional charge per day and an administrative fee in an amount as established from time to time by resolution of the Board of Supervisors. [*Ord. 05-112*]

2. *Penalties.* Any owner of a vehicle impounded under authority of this Part who fails to claim and pay the towing charges and storage charges for the vehicle within 10 days from the date of towing/impounding shall be guilty of violating this Part and upon conviction be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 and/or undergo imprisonment for a period of not more than 30 days.
